The Campaign to Change Direction

While most of us are comfortable acknowledging and seeking help for a physical condition, such as a heart attack or stroke, many more of us aren't so quick to recognize or seek help for emotional suffering and pain.

The Campaign to Change Direction is a coalition of concerned people who have come together to "change the story" in America about mental health, mental illness and wellness.

According to the National Alliance of Mental Illness, a mental illness is a condition that impacts a person's thinking, feeling or mood, and may affect his or her ability to relate to others and function on a daily basis. Many of us experience emotional suffering for which we rarely reach out for support. For the next few weeks this portion of our bulletin will look at ways of recognizing emotional pain in others and ourselves, and how to experience some help in that time of need. Faith tells us, Jesus shows us...we never have to walk alone.

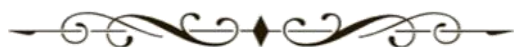
